WVEA-PAC is the independent, political arm of the WVEA, the state's largest organization representing teachers and service personnel. WVEA-PAC's recommended candidates are:

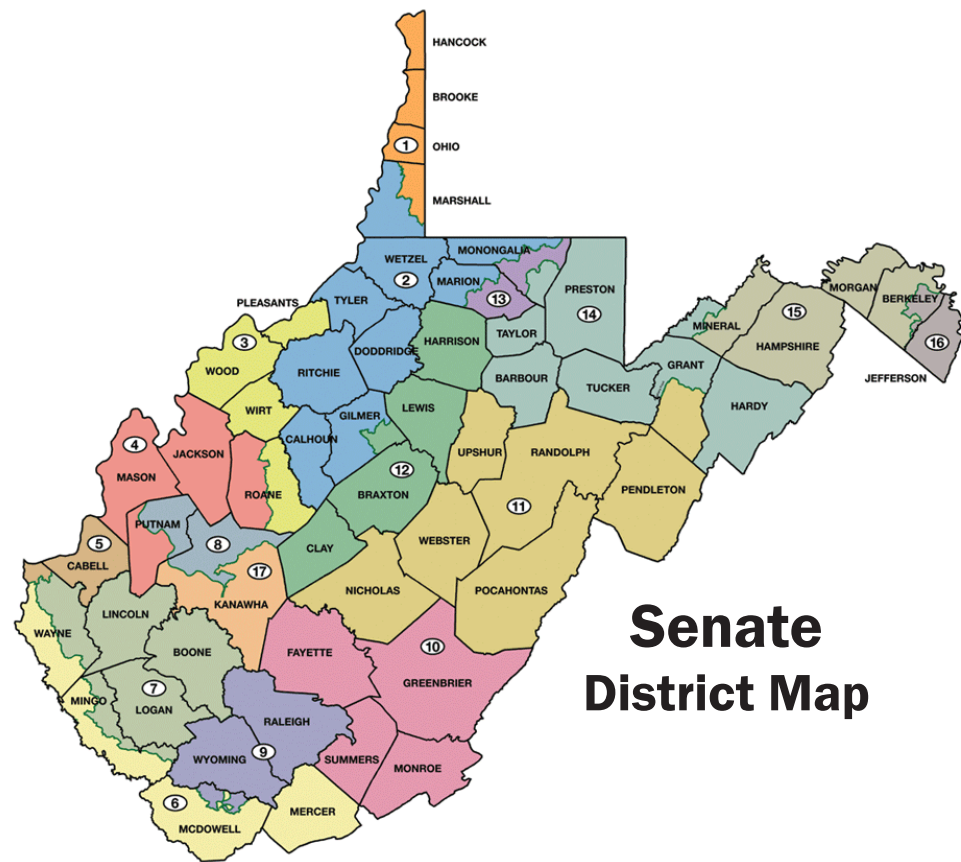

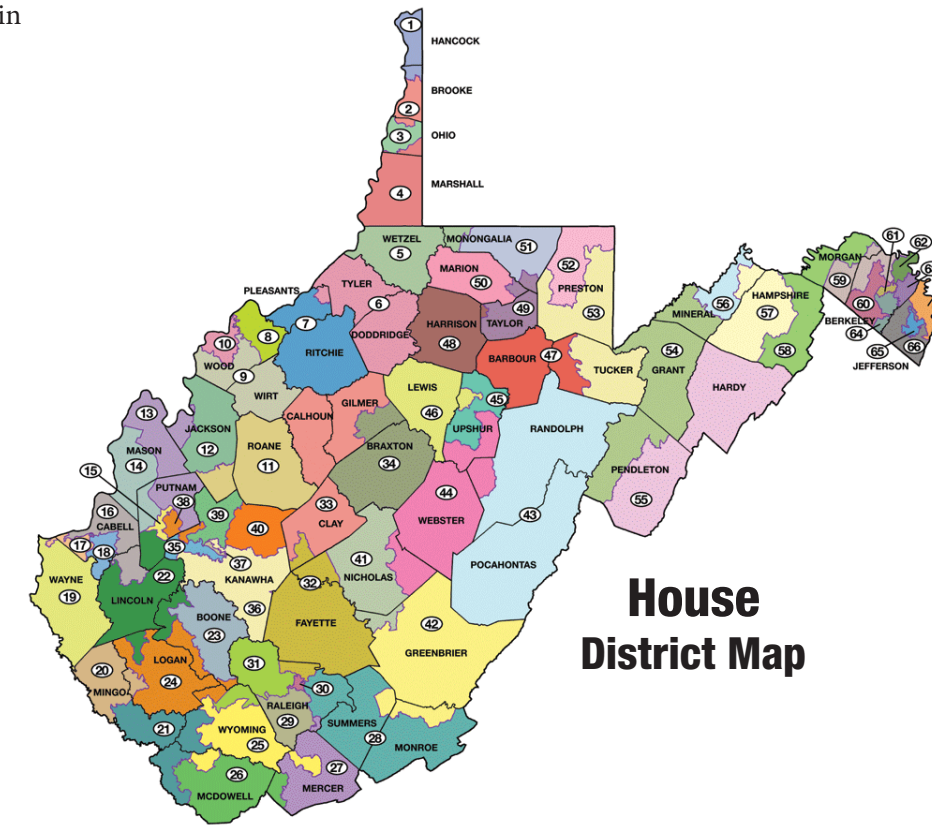


Senate District Map
